Women's Soccer

Peninsula College launched women's soccer in 2010 and the Pirates made an immediate impact on the Northwest Athletic Association of Community Colleges (NWAACC). In 2011, the Pirates won the West Division and finished second in the NWAACC. In 2012, the Pirates won the West Division again and claimed their first NWAACC championship. The Pirates finished the season 23-1-0 and earned a top 10 national ranking while becoming the second highest scoring team in NWAACC history. Since 2011 the Pirates have compiled a 40-4-3 record, had 13 players selected to the All-Star team, had two Regional Players of the Year, one NWAACC player of the year and 10 Academic All-Stars. The program attracts elite players from Washington, Idaho, Oregon, California, Alaska, Hawaii, Canada, Australia and Brazil.



Women's Soccer Head Coach Canyon Anderson

Coach Canyon Anderson is a graduate of Western Washington University (BA – English Literature) and Eastern Washington University (MA – Rhetoric and Composition). He also played in the NWAACC for Everett Community College before transferring to Eastern Washington University. He holds a National "C"


Coaching License. Coach Anderson has been recognized as the West Region Coach of the Year in 2011 and 2012 and earned NWAACC Coach of the Year in 2011. Before taking over the women's program he was the assistant men's coach, helping to build the program into the perennial power they are today. In addition to coaching soccer, he is a member of the Peninsula College English faculty. He spends his free time with his wife and son, hiking and camping in the Olympics. Men's Soccer

The Peninsula Pirates have established themselves as a Northwest Athletic Association of Community Colleges (NWAACC) soccer super power with eight straight trips to the playoffs, five Final Four appearances, five of the last six West Division championships and four consecutively. In 2010 the Pirates won their first NWAACC Championship and in 2012, won their second championship, finishing with a 22-1-1 record and ranked #7 nationally. Head coach Andrew Chapman and his staff have assembled a program that every year draws talented student athletes from all over the world who unite under one goal – winning a championship.

Head Coach Andrew Chapman took over a struggling Peninsula College program in 2003 and built a soccer machine that has produced eight straight trips to the playoffs, five Final Four appearances, five West Division championships (2007, 2009, 2010, 2011, 2012) and two NWAACC championships (2010

and 2012). Coach Chapman has been named NWAACC Coach of the Year three times and has earned the West Region Coach of the Year title five times. He received a Master's of Science in Physical Education from Eastern Washington University and is among a select few coaches in America with a National "B" License from the US Soccer Federation. In addition to coaching soccer at Peninsula, he serves as the college's Physical Education Coordinator.
